# Summer festivities celebrated 50 years of caring for our community

On August 4, CMH hosted our 50th anniversary celebration on the lawn of the hospital, exactly 50 years to the date when the hospital opened in 1958. In attendance were residents of Sunnyside Health Care Center, employees and community members.

Speakers included former Minnesota Supreme Court Justice Lawrence Yetka, the only surviving member of the original board. He discussed the history of getting the hospital built and talked about the tenacity and perseverance of area residents who fought so hard and long to see the hospital become a reality. Although the first discussions regarding a city hospital started in the 1940s, it took almost a decade to realize their dream. The Hon. Lawrence Yetka also reflected on the tremendous support the hospital received from industry and community members, with Northwest Paper donating eight acres of land for the site of the hospital.

Dr. Byron Backus, a member of the original physician staff, recalled numerous stories about the first days of the hospital and how one of the reasons he accepted a physician position in Cloquet was because of the hospital on the hill.

Bonnie Kloskowski, Registered Nurse, reminisced about the day the hospital opened and how one patient couldn't figure out where the voice was coming from when the nurse responded to her call light through the new PA system from the nurse's desk. She shared many other stories from those first days, including how there wasn't an on-site pharmacy, requiring the pharmacist to deliver medication from the downtown store every time a new prescription was ordered.

Stan DeMenge, former director of physical plant services, shared numerous details about the various building projects over the years, including how a closet was turned into useable hospital space.

Becky Lourey, former State Senator and State Representative, wrapped up the ceremony and praised the hospital administration for its commitment to the community and the concept of rural health care.

A time capsule filled with paper documents, as well as various types of medical instruments was buried on the hospital grounds following the ceremony.
