e're proud to announce the opening of the Short-Term Rehabilitation Unit at SHCC—a comfortable, private unit located on the first floor of Sunnyside Health Care Center where patients receive professional nursing care following surgery, illness or a fall.

An interdisciplinary CMH and SHCC team provides 24-hour care and a "short-term" stay can be anywhere between one and 100 days. The beautiful new unit includes eight fully furnished private rooms, each one including a recliner, flat screen TV and telephone. Two gyms offer space and equipment for patients—under the care of physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech-language pathologists—to regain strength, range of motion, mobility and other abilities.

### A GREAT PLACE TO RECOVER

When your doctor prescribes skilled nursing care after surgery, illness or a fall, our new Short-Term Rehabilitation Unit is a great place to recover from:

- Hip, knee and other joint replacements
- Fractures
- Arthritis and osteoporosis
- Stroke

- Parkinson's disease
- Fall management
- Cardiac and respiratory disease management, including congestive heart failure and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

### TRANSITION FROM HOSPITAL **TO HOME**

Patients at the Short-Term Rehabilitation Unit will receive rehabilitation services under the care of their physician and an interdisciplinary team, which may include a physical therapist, occupational therapist, speech-language pathologist, nurses, a social worker, a registered dietitian and our activities coordinator. Our interdisciplinary team will ensure that patients will be ready for a safe and successful transition to home.

■ PHYSICAL THERAPISTS use exercise, modalities, manual techniques, balance activities, gait and therapeutic activities to help achieve their highest level of independent functional mobility. With each patient's input, we establish goals and can provide physical therapy up to seven days a week, depending (Story continued on next page)

on the patient's individual plan of care. Physical therapy provides education to the patient, family, caregivers, and staff to help each patient achieve their goals.

- OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS help patients regain independence by simulating tasks that patients will perform on a daily basis and are typical of things they would do at home. They also guide patients in activities to strengthen a patient's upper extremities and fine motor activities.
- SPEECH LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS offer treatment sessions for patients who have swallowing or communication problems. The CMH Speech-Language Pathology Department is certified to provide specialized intensive treatments including Vital Stim and Lee Silverman Voice Treatment.
- THE ACTIVITIES DEPARTMENT focuses on each patient's quality of life and is an essential part of the rehab team. Our activity professionals focus on each resident as a whole person with physical, mental, spiritual and psychosocial needs. Our activity professionals are licensed and certified occupational therapy assistants, and specialize in therapeutic activities for the elderly.

### STAY CLOSE TO HOME WHILE YOU RECOVER

To qualify for a stay at the Short-Term Rehabilitation Unit at SHCC, a patient must be in need of skilled



services. If you or a family member is planning to schedule an elective surgery, you can pre-plan your recovery and rehabilitation to take place at our Short-Term Rehabilitation Unit immediately following your discharge from the hospital.
