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Specialty Care Clinic at CMH

id you know that many medical services you might associate with a big-city hospital are available right here in Cloquet? CMH offers these professional medical services and procedures at our growing Specialty Care Clinic. Our ability to provide specialty medical treatments at the Clinic, such as out-patient infusions or ongoing wound care, helps our patients by allowing them to receive important treatments close to home, while saving time and travel expenses.

Watch for more news about our Specialty Care Clinic in 2011. Part of the new CMH expansion project—which breaks ground this year—is a plan for a new facility to house the CMH Specialty Care Clinic.

■ HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY In 2010, CMH partnered with SMDC to bring these services to the Cloquet area. Four times a month, Dr. John Sande, Oncologist or a nurse practitioner is available at the Specialty Care Clinic to see patients who have any type of cancer or blood disorder. Treatments may include providing out-patient infusions or chemotherapy, fluids for hydration, antibiotics, and blood products for anemia, immune diseases or blood disorders. Hematology/Oncology staff provide central intravenous lines and line maintenance,

dressing changes and wound care Monday-Friday, 7 am-3:30 pm. Care is provided by a registered nursing staff certified in infusion therapy. A referral from your doctor is necessary. For more information or to schedule an appointment, call 218-878-7609.

- **ORTHOPEDICS** Dr. Timothy McLeod, Dr. Mark Gregerson, and Dr. Clint Moen are board-certified Orthopedic Surgeons who provide diagnostic arthroscopies, fracture repair, dislocations, bunion-ectomies, carpal tunnel release (open and endoscopic), rotator cuff repair, ACL repair/reconstruction, bone spur removal/debridement, hip and knee arthroplasties (total joint replacement), and trigger finger release. - PAIN MANAGEMENT Dr. Paul Vollmar, Anesthesiologist, treats individuals with many kinds of chronic pain, such as chronic headaches, back pain and many other pain issues. Pain treatment methods include steroid injection; nerve blocks, including facial nerve blocks; trigger point injections; radio frequency ablation; and implantable spinal cord stimulators.
