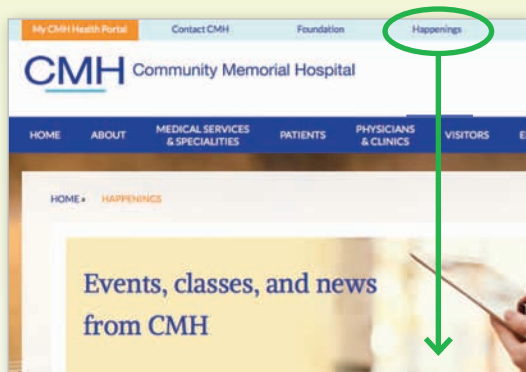

## Foundation donates \$197,000 to hospital for two projects



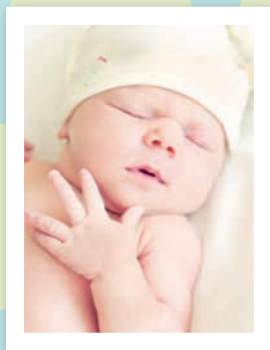
**O**ver \$192,000 will be spent on new state of the art, mobile arthroscopic equipment for General Surgery and Orthopedics Departments. This equipment will enable surgeons to utilize up to three surgical suites simultaneously to perform arthroscopic surgery. The 4K High Definition Imaging equipment is used in arthroscopic procedures

which allow surgeons to make smaller incisions when performing surgery. Almost all CMH surgical specialists use this type of equipment in their surgeries. This equipment is an upgrade to the equipment currently used by surgeons.

Dr. Kyle Menzel, orthopedic surgeon, expressed much gratitude to the Foundation for their generous contribution, saying, "It is very much appreciated and will allow us to better take care of our patients."

Nearly \$4,200 of the Foundation contribution was used to provide badge-reading equipment for the Emergency Services department. The new equipment will ensure that only authorized personnel are able to enter restricted areas within the department. "This further enhances the security of the emergency area," according to Paul Charon, Director of Building and Grounds.

## Sunnyside Health Care Center named a top nursing home in Minnesota

**S**unnyside Health Care Center has been named one of the Best Nursing Homes in Minnesota as reported by US News and World Report.

The award is based on annual federal and state life safety and health survey results that measure compliance and quality; 24 distinct federal quality measures; and the facility's direct care staffing levels as measured in hours of direct care provided each resident, including acuity factor, per day. A five-star rating is the highest level and SHCC has received this designation for the past four years.

"I've worked in nursing homes for 27 years and never, until now, worked in one that is five star," says Jeff Brown, Vice President of Long Term Care and Ancillary Services at SHCC/CMH. He says only about 10% of all nursing homes are five-star rated. Jeff joined the SHCC/CMH staff in 2015 and says the highest rating is humbling, but also a motivator. He credits all departments and staff for their culture of caring, person-centered approach and commitment

## CMH designated acute stroke-ready hospital

**C**MH has been designated as an acute stroke-ready hospital, a designation which recognizes the staff's preparedness to evaluate, stabilize and provide emergency treatment to patients with acute stroke symptoms.

Nearly one in three Minnesota stroke victims receives their first care at a small rural hospital.

In 2013, the Minnesota Legislature authorized the Minnesota Department of Health to designate hospitals in Minnesota as "stroke hospitals." A coordinated statewide system of care ensures all hospitals are equipped and ready to provide the best care possible for all stroke patients. **CMH**

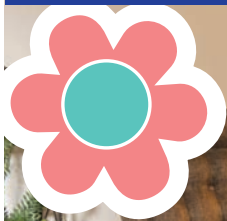
