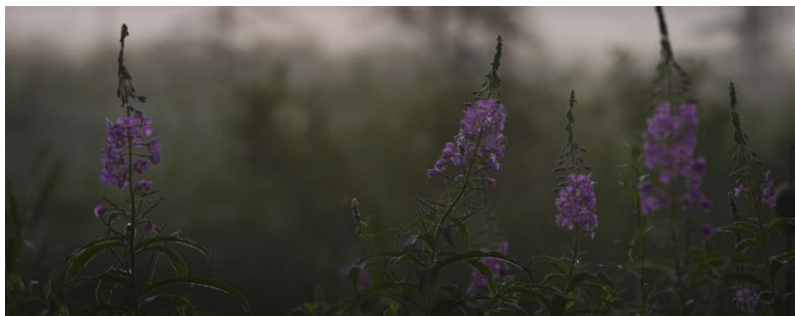




It's April 1st, no fooling! Here's a round up of the latest updates from Community Memorial Hospital.

Visitor Policy Update

Effective immediately, CMH patients are allowed to have two adult visitors at a time. Previously, they were required to be the same two visitors all day. Presently, these visitors may change throughout the day as long as there are no more than two at a time. No children are allowed to visit at this time.



Celebrating our Advanced Wound Clinic!

For the fourth year in a row, our Advanced Wound Clinic was awarded the Center of Distinction Award by Healogics, the nation's largest provider of wound care services. For the last twelve months, our wound clinic has maintained a patient satisfaction rate higher than 92 percent and a minimum wound healing rate of at least 92 percent.

For the first time, the wound clinic was also awarded the prestigious Robert A. Warriner III, MD Clinical Excellence Award for being in the top 10 percent of healing rates among over 600 clinics nationwide.

Clinic Director Betsy Johnson said, "I could not be prouder of the team here. They continually rise above every challenge placed in front of them and provide the best care to every patient who comes through our door..."

The providers and staff at the Advanced Wound Clinic provide the treatments necessary to heal patients more quickly than traditional wound care, which results in faster healing times, fewer amputations, and overall better patient outcomes. Therapies include negative pressure wound therapy, total contact casting, bio-engineered tissues, biosynthetic dressings and growth factor

therapies. The Advanced Wound Clinic also offers hyperbaric oxygen therapy, which works by surrounding the patient with 100 percent oxygen to help progress the healing of wounds such as diabetic foot ulcers and radiation injuries.
